Access Information

This document has specific information on the accessibility measures available for IMRSE's 2024 production of CAKE.

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Wheelchair and Mobility Aid Access.

There are wheelchair and mobility aid accessible seats available. Please contact Metro Arts in advance on 07 3002 7100 or at info@metroarts.com.au, or come see us at front of house. There are flat floors and a small lift, allowing you to enter the venue.

At one point, flutter (small pieces of confetti-like paper) will be dropped from the ceiling. After the show, there will be an immediate sweep of the area, allowing you to pass through if you have any concern about slipping or wheels being jammed.

Strobe.

CAKE uses strobe lighting once, and bright flashing lights throughout the show, including one major dance number. Light sensitivity cue cards are available if you need to prepare yourself or close your eyes.

Light Sensitivity Cue Cards.

To aid those with sensory sensitivities, Front of House will be providing a Light Sensitivity Cue Card. You can scan a QR code to access it, or there will be a

limited number of printed copies available at the front desk. The information from the Light Sensitivity Cue Card is also copied here:

LIGHTING SENSITIVITY CUE CARD.

Welcome to CAKE!

As part of our accessibility program for this show, we are providing anyone with light sensitivity with this cue card. It shows the lines <u>immediately before</u> our two major lighting events so that you can prepare yourself or close your eyes.

Your lines are:

"King Louis the Sixteenth, if you don't drop your ruffled pantaloons and pollinate the delicate rose bud of my precious chastity this instant, I am going to lose it!"

(Before a strobe effect.)

And...

"Yes, now! Isn't that what you all want? A party with sex? PLACES EVERYONE!"

(Before a major dance number with flashing, colourful lights. This goes for approximately 4 minutes.)

Some seats in the theatre are also marked as being bad for people with light sensitivity. If you are assigned to one of these seats, either swap with someone near you or come speak to us here!

Light Sensitivity Seating Arrangements.

Seats have been evaluated for exposure to bright lights. Any seat deemed entirely inaccessible to those with light sensitivity will have a placard placed on them. If your seat has this placard, please either swap with someone around you, or come see us at Front of House for support. The information on the placard has been copied here:

This seat is not suitable for someone with light sensitivity. If this is you, please swap seats with someone or come speak to us at the front!

Haze Machine Specifications.

CAKE uses a haze machine throughout the show. We are using a Unique 2 Haze Machine with Unique Fluid, which is water based. It contains no oil or silicone

and ingredients correspond to the highest purity level. It is a mixture of polyhydric alcohols and water, with no hazardous ingredients.

It contains one or more of the following:

- Triethylene Glycol (CAS# 112-27-6)
- Monopropylene Glycol (CAS# 57-55-6)
- Dipropylene Glycol (CAS# 110-98-5)
- Demineralised Water (CAS# 7732-1805)

Tiered Trigger Warning System.

For this show, IMRSE has developed a Tiered Trigger Warning system. Recent research has suggested that trigger warnings are not as effective as previously understood. However, we believe that removing trigger warnings and not replacing them with any other proven options would be irresponsible.

This system is a product that we are still developing, so it may not be perfect.

Everyone in the industry is still learning what exactly best practice looks like in regard to accessibility. Our goal is to learn, grow, and experiment as we work towards what is best practice for us.

At IMRSE, we make art where <u>you</u> choose your own experience. Our Tiered Trigger Warnings work the same way.

Anything you choose to look at <u>will have spoilers</u>. It will change your experience of the show. We have split the warnings into sections so that you can choose what you need or want to know. This choice is yours.

All tiers of triggers are available across the next five pages of this document.

There is space between each section so that you can pick and choose what warnings you want or need to see. Please skip the next five pages if you do not want to see these.
