1 Untitled Small (window piece)

Weyba clay and oil on linen, Mixed media sculpture, Weyba endemic flora and fungi.

2 Arc Viewer

Weathered fabricated steel, glass, Weyba endemic flora and fungi, purified water, grow lights.

3 Untitled (bronze piece)

Cast Bronze, patina finished.

4 Myco-sonification (with headphones)

Weathered fabricated steel, mixed media sculpture, electronics (hydrophone in soil, headphones), Weyba endemic flora and fungi, purified water, grow lights.

5 Weyba (soil with visualisations)

Mixed media sculpture, electronics (electrodes, screen), Weyba endemic flora and fungi, grow lights, blown glass vessel, purified water.

6 Untitled (projection)

Weyba clay and oil on linen, video projection.

7 Untitled (grouping of 3)


Weathered fabricated steel, mixed media sculpture, Weyba endemic flora and fungi, purified water, grow lights, blown glass vessel, naturally dyed Agar, tubing.

8 Untitled (Window Gallery)

Weyba clay and oil on linen, mixed media sculpture, Weyba endemic flora and fungi, purified water.


9 Sounding Myc-a - Sound score (11.34mins)

ARTIST OVERVIEW

Bianca Tainsh

Terra Culture is an exploration of terra-biomes — symbiotic bodies of flora and microfauna, intimately connected by underground fungal networks.

Audiences will encounter an immersive space, where interaction with living sculptures invites sensual encounter with the artist's terra-biomes to reveal our parallel and synergetic existences. The exhibition will also provoke a visceral self-identification, uncovering the human state as its own multi-species biome.

Over two years, this project has evolved through collaborations with ecologists and computing researchers in conjunction with sculptors and fabricators, ultimately leading Tainsh to create portals connecting us with more-than-human intelligence.

CURATORS NOTE

Daniel Clifford

Organised within the space of Gallery One at Metro Arts, Bianca Tainsh's exhibition Terra Culture operates as an ecosystem of works, each composed of multiple organisms and environments that themselves house further ecosystems. Working across a broad expanse of materials and drawing on the diverse expertise of multiple collaborators, even the very act of creating this exhibition functions as an ecosystem in its own right. Tainsh prompts us to reflect on our impact and our relationship not only with the environment but with the organic inhabitants that thrive within it. Like a vast neural network combined with the underground systems of mycelium, viewers engage directly with the works as the works, in turn, engage with them. Our energies exist in symbiosis with these bioforms, and over the course of the exhibition the works—and the life within them—will grow, expand, and transform. Terra Culture invites audiences to immerse themselves and allow their energies to be absorbed into this living exchange, where each visit will shift the mood of the space, heightened by portals to Lake Weyba—the biomes' place of origin.

ARTIST BIO

Bianca Tainsh is a multi-artform artist, based in Meanjin Brisbane and on Lake Weyba, Kabi Kabi Country. Through a hybrid practice of contemporary art and fluid forms of ecological activities Tainsh explores issues such as the cyber-saturated human's disconnect from the natural world and the search for spirituality in the epoch of digital culture. In Tainsh's current work, Neo-animism forms the trope for artefacts and rituals that unveil new forms of coexistence and being.

Tainsh's work takes the form of video, digital and semi-traditional media, assemblages, installation and live art. Organic imagery, materials and processes find new meaning as they meet the aesthetics of digital production. Tainsh considers the more-than-human organisms she works with to be collaborators in her artmaking.
